North Herts Rugby and Netball Festival 2021

The first ever North Herts Rugby and Netball Festival proved to be a huge success!

Combining a sports tournament and a community food festival, Hitchin Rugby Club was awash with happy faces glad to see a sense of normality return thanks to NH21.



With lead sponsors Mason Navarro Pledge (MNP) in tow, the team who delivered the "Back2Schoolival" tournaments from 2015-2018 returned to the festival scene for their first post-pandemic event. A new concept based on local sports clubs brought over 450 players to the site on the day.

18 teams competed in the "CALA Homes" Cup and Social Cup in netball. 16 teams fought it out to take the "Cawsburger Cup" home in the men's 10's tournament. Nine teams went toe to toe in the "Succession Wealth" cup and plate competition in a showcase of ladies Rugby7's.

With the majority of teams hailing from Hertfordshire, accompanied by guests from Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, London, Reading and Buckinghamshire, the sports community were out in full force with large crowds gathering to cheer their team on.

They were treated to some competitive action, played in good spirits across the board and some tight encounters, none more so than the Men's final which saw Letchworth run out Cawsburger Cup winners after scoring an extra time, golden point try against Cantabs. The home team, Hitchin Ladies, made sure the Succession Wealth Cup stayed in Hitchin by winning their tournament, defeating close neighbours Welwyn in the final.



Chairman's report

Another year passes and I am again reporting on a disrupted season. COVID-19 resulted in no league rugby and minimal competitive activity on the field of play. That said, it remains a credit to all the coaches and volunteers who despite circumstances kept activity taking place throughout the lock downs.

Financially, the club has remained strong; support from the government though grants and more importantly from the continued support of our sponsors MNP, Kelly Group, Raymond James, HRJ Foreman Laws and IPM along with donations from the Hitchin Youth Trust have ensured that we have weathered the pandemic without significant financial damage.

When considering finances, I also thank all club members who maintained their subscriptions during the pandemic. Credit also goes to Chris Jones, who's stewardship of the

club finances has yet again helped to secure the Club's position.

The coming season will bring challenges. Our Women's teams have both been promoted and will be travelling greater distances next season, this is a challenge both for player retention and costs, especially given the reduction of financial support from the RFU for the community game. The men's leagues will be restructured at the end of the 2021-22 season so gaining a good league position to ensure promotion is also critical. For M&Y, the loss and disruption of over a year of rugby must be considered an unknown.

The loss of a final youth season for our U18 group was a terrible shame. Missing out on the opportunity to enjoy their last season together is not the fitting end to a long and successful journey in youth rugby and I can but hope it does not dampen their enthusiasm for the game in the future.

Men's playing report 2020-21

The season was hit by Covid-19, but the Men's squad still trained twice a week between July 2020 and May 2021 - except for the enforced lockdown breaks in November 2020 and January to March 2021.

The challenge was to meet the Covid-19 rules. The MNP Cup (a touch tournament) had 80+ attendees for midweek and Saturday matches played throughout December 2020.

Matches were also played in May 2021, with a loss to Stockwood Park in the last minute of the game. This meant we played in a Plate competition with wins against Biggleswade and Royston and Hitchin winning the Plate competition. The 2XV lost their plate final to Biggleswade and had a friendly game vs Stevenage that ended in a 36-36 draw.

Numbers at training have been really good with a consistent group of players training throughout. The Men's section has also recruited three new coaches to the Adam Shaw's team: Ian Crompton as defence coach, Gary Ayres as S&C coach and Gavin McLeod as an assistant coach.

Ladies update

Hitchin Ladies have had a great preseason so far which is standing the squad in good stead as both our teams enter new leagues this year off the back of promotion. In addition to seeing great numbers at preseason training and lots of new faces, we have also returned to competitive contact rugby post-Covid.

We had our first run-out at Shelford 7s in July and most recently North Herts 21, where we won the Women's X Rugby 7s tournament.

Last weekend, we played our first preseason friendly against Fullerians Ladies which we won 21-0, a great result considering this was the first 15-a-side match in more than 18 months. Now, our attention turns to our upcoming preseason matches against Hampstead on 4 September, Royston on 9th September, and Shelford on the 12th September.

We are also hosting a Pitch Up and Play event on 11 September (12:30-2pm) as part of the RFU's celebration of rugby week, where we hope to recruit more new players in preparation for the season ahead.

The upcoming season gets underway on the 26 September with both teams playing at home - the 1st XV face West Bridgford while the 2nd XV
