NHRN 2023 Festival

The North Herts Rugby and Netball festival returned for it's third year at Hitchin RFC on Saturday 12 August. Another wonderful display of rugby from all teams was enjoyed by all, and a large crowd gathered on Pitch 1 to witness the final between Hitchin and Dartford. There were plenty of big hits and some brilliant try in an end to end game which was eventually won by Dartford, who were crowned as this years Raymond James Cup winners.

Running in tandem was the men's 10's tournament which saw Hitchin joined by both Bedford Queens and a Letchworth development team for their 3rd appearance at NHRN, alongside Bedford Swifts and Finsbury Park making their tournament debut. Some more wonderful, flowing rugby was on display as well as an introduction to the new community tackle laws that are being introduced this year and a first meeting between Hitchin and Letchworth in the group. It led to a final, again on Pitch 1, which saw Hitchin take on Letchworth with a huge crowd watching on. Both teams played some brilliant rugby mixed with an incredible level of physicality. It was so tight that only one score separated the two teams come the final whistle, with Hitchin running out winners and adding their name to the Cawsburger Cup.

Away from the rugby, the club also hosted the Hitchin Street Food monthly team for delicious food and drink throughout the day and with England playing Wales in a world cup warm up match on the big screen, the club bar also did a healthy trade. All while raising almost £500 for the Alzheimers society, this years charity of choice for NHRN.

Men's 1XV

The 1XV produced a remarkable 2022-23 season, exceeding all expectations to finish in 5th place out of 12 teams in the league, qualifying for the Herts President's Cup Final and reaching the Quarter Finals of the Papa John's Plate.

The section experienced a reduction in playing numbers and the quantity of matches played suffered as a result. Rugby for all abilities and experience is fundamental to our club.

A successful recruitment and retention campaign over the summer will be central to the return of regular rugby at development and social levels in the 23/24 season and beyond. Pre-season started in July under new Head Coach Gavin McLeod, and our season has started successfully with the winners trophy at North Herts 10s and a friendly win versus Bishops Stortford Mitres.



Women's rugby

The ladies have been working on introducing a new style of play for this season, implementing a faster, 'heads up' rugby approach.
